This summary captures the main discussion points and decisions made at the 29 July 2022 Executive Group meeting.

The Executive agreed to proceed with the implementation of the NSPCC's Neglect Graded Care Profile 2 Toolkit. This will be taken forward by the CHSCP's Neglect Working Group.

It was also noted that the MOSAIC system was fully operational following the Hackney cyber-attack.

The cost of living was highlighted as a significant risk to children and families. The Executive was informed that the Boards had convened an extraordinary meeting to discuss mitigation measures in response to the crisis.

The Executive also received an update on the Child Q Action Plan. Key strands of work included: working with schools, trust and confidence in the police, anti-racism, and community engagement. The plan was progressing at pace. The Executive was informed that the National Panel had delivered its first public statement since the publication of the report.

The Executive discussed the National Review in response to the murders of Arthur Labinjo-Hughes and Star Hobson. Assurances were made against the four key recommendations for safeguarding partnerships. These covered effective strategy discussions, resourcing multi-agency meetings, information sharing agreements and the thorough assessment of referrals.

In other business, there was a proposal to explore a young scrutineers programme similar to the one delivered at Tower Hamlets. It was agreed that RMc would produce a briefing paper for the next meeting so the Executive could come to a decision.

The meeting concluded with the Executive expressing their thanks and appreciation to Commander Marcus Barnett for his contributions towards the Partnership and wished him all the best in his new role.

The ISCC thanked colleagues for their time and closed the meeting.
