The purpose of this extraordinary meeting was to provide the Executive with oversight of the Child Q Action Plan following the Child Q Core Review Group meeting.

The ISCC provided the following briefing:

- A follow-up Child Q report would be published in December 2022
- There were fourteen recommendations on the action plan which were either rated amber or green in terms of progress.
- It was confirmed that no MTIP searches had taken place on children under eighteen years of age.
- The Independent Safeguarding Children Commissioner had written to the Department of Education to express concern with its revised guidance on carrying out strip searches in schools.
- The Adultification training programme was ongoing and it was hoped would make a meaningful impact.
- There was an intention to survey young people in schools as a quality assurance exercise.

Overall the Executive was reassured that partner agencies were collaborating on the Child Q Action Plan. It was proposed that JB sit on the Community Safety Partnership Board to ensure oversight of the 'trust in the police' strand of work instead of creating a new sub-group.

The ISCC thanked colleagues for their time and closed the meeting.
