Our organisation has completed a CHSCP Self-Assessment.



Nature / Type of Organisation and Services Provided:

We are a full day nursery, catering for children from age one - five. Our nursery has a warm environment and is very popular within the community. We provide a safe and caring place, where every child is valued and treated as an individual. Our programme follows the EYFS to give the children skills for life

Our commitment to safeguarding children:

Lubavitch Nursery takes the responsibilities of Child Protection and safeguarding seriously. Staff are trained regularly and understand how to identify concerns and to whom they should express their concerns. We contact the relevant Hackney MASH, Safeguarding Team when the need arises. Staff all have DBS checks

Risk that children might face (1)

Risk that staff are unclear about safeguarding implications / staff do not respond appropriately to issues.

How are we mitigating this risk? (1)

All staff are suitably / regularly trained and are clear on whom to talk to if they have a concern. Includes:
induction of new staff where procedures are discussed at length.
Review of policy at Inset meetings, particularly when there are changes to the law or our policy.
Volunteers and Temporary staff are given brief training and are not left unattended

Risk that children might face (2)

Risk a child may be rough handled or pulled to the extend that it may cause the child harm.

How are we mitigating this risk? (2)

Staff are advised that children are very delicate and we must handle them with care. This is in the Policy and new staff are explained about the seriousness
we use the following Policies

Risk that children might face (3)

Risk of photos or videos taken of the children in the nursery being misused or abused

How are we mitigating this risk? (3)

No- phone Policy
We explain to every single parent that we have a no - phone policy. we remind staff of this policy and have no-phone signs
e-safety awareness evening for parents

Risk that children might face (4)

Risk that children could be in receipt of the incorrect medicine

How are we mitigating this risk? (4)

In the application form we ask parents for any allergies/intolerances/ needs that their children may have. This is then displayed in the rooms. we have First Aiders that have up to date training
Administration of Medicine Policy
Allergies policy
parents complete a form and staff note, date and sign when medicine is given

Risk that children might face (5)

Risk of harm from unannounced visitors - maintenance deliveries

How are we mitigating this risk? (5)

Use of visitors sign in book
Supervision of children Procedure
no visitor is left unattended
