Physical Abuse: Intentional harm such as hitting, shaking, or other forms of physical injury.

Risk that children might face (2)

Emotional abuse that can affect a child's emotional development, like verbal abuse or constant criticism

Any form of sexual activity with a child; grooming, exploitation, and inappropriate touching or exposure.

Factors that can affect a child's mental health, like stress, anxiety, depression.
