## Nature / Type of Organisation and Services Provided:

Primary School.  
Education for children aged 3-11.  
Additional services within school include Mental Health Support Team, WAMHS< speech and Language therapy and Educational Psychologist services.

## Our commitment to safeguarding children:

Harrington Hill Primary school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all of our pupils. Each pupil's welfare is of paramount importance.

Everyone at Harrington Hill Primary school who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play in safeguarding children. School staff are particularly important in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children as we are in a position to identify concerns early and provide help for children.

Our school staff form part of the wider safeguarding system for children to prevent concerns from escalating. Our school will work with Children and Families Service, the police, health services and other relevant agencies to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm.

Harrington Hill Primary school will ensure all staff are aware of their safeguarding and child protection responsibilities and that they are able to identify children and young people where concerns about their safety and welfare arise.

### Risk that children might face (1)

- Governors not being up to date with their safeguarding training

### How are we mitigating this risk? (1)

1. We have invited governors to attend the school's annual safeguarding training and if unable to attend, have ensured they have completed online training and read the school's policies and the most up to date KCSIE part 1. It has also been added as an item in the full governing body meeting agenda.

### Risk that children might face (2)

- External organisations not having thorough enough checks in line with the school's safeguarding

### How are we mitigating this risk? (2)

2. Prior to external organisations starting work on school site, DBS checks are carried out and the school requests their safeguarding policy which may be adapted in line with the school's. The school ensures external providers have an allocated, fully trained, Designated Safeguarding Lead if operating outside of school teaching hours.

- All volunteers not being fully aware of reporting procedures

3. All volunteers are expected to complete full induction which includes safeguarding information.
